A CODE OF CONDUCT FOR TEAM MANAGERS, COACHES AND CLUB OFFICIALS AT CAYTHORPE AND FULBECK JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB MATCHES

Everyone connected to Caythorpe and Fulbeck JFC have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game, particularly our Team Managers, Coaches and Club Officials.

On and off the field, I will:

- Show respect to others involved in the game, including match officials, opposition players, coaches, managers, officials and spectators
- Abide by the ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY and RESPECT POLICY of the local junior football leagues and the FA.
- Adhere to the laws and spirit of the game
- Promote fair play and high standards of behaviour
- Always respect the match official's decision
- Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission
- Never engage in public criticism of the match officials
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.
- Communicate with parents / carers at all times re. Match and training arrangements, team selection policy, their codes of conduct and share this information both before the start of each season and throughout.
- Monitor the conduct of parents and spectators watching the game and take action accordingly

When working with players, I will:

- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything, including winning
- Adhere to the JFC Player Welfare Development Plan
- Explain exactly what I expect of players and what they can expect from me
- Ensure all parents / carers of all players under the age of 18 understand these expectations
- Never engage in or tolerate any form of bullying
- Develop mutual trust and respect with every player to build their self-esteem
- Encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance
- Ensure all activities I organise are appropriate for all the players' ability level, age and maturity and that the facilities I use are safe and appropriate for the activity to take place
- Co-operate fully with others in football for each player's best interests – e.g. Physio's Dr's, Welfare Officers

I understand that if I do not follow the code. Any or all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, League or The FA

- Required to meet with the club, league or County Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the JFC Committee
- Monitored by another appointed coach
- Required to attend an FA education course
- Suspended by the club from attending matches
- Suspended or fined by the County FA
- Required to leave the club
